## Improving PAC workflow

- introduce a kind of Communication App to replace email: Email is very messy. We will explore several tools, starting with Slack, in a small group, and then extending it.
- introduce small video meetings for event discussion: Martin proposed regular short online meetings to improve the development of events. We decided not to meet regularly, but occasionally as the chairs see fit.

- long-term planning: Collection of foreseeable events like trade shows: Elections and tradeshow are foreseeable dates for PAC events. For example: If an organisation holds a defense industry trade show, we might be able to get interesting speakers in advance or at the time of the show. PAC staff sets up a Google Docs file in which all PAC members put in the events that they think are of interests.

## The Streaming Story:

We revisited the issue of live streaming of PAC events again at PAC. We would like to share our opinions about live streaming and online memberships with you, if possible in a face-to-face meeting at the Club.

In a nutshell, here is our current position:

1. Live streaming is part of a bigger reform:

Live streaming and the introduction of an online membership are closely related. Stopping live streaming only makes sense if we have an online membership category in place which requires expenditure to integrate the membership database with a paywall (and to do it safely).

2. Stopping of Live streaming by other media:

The contentious issue is that other media earn money by live streaming and archiving our events. We suggested stopping of live streaming by other media ourselves in the past. But we have a different opinion now.

Stopping of live streaming by other media is only advisable if we can really promote our homepage and online experience ourselves, including having an online membership and a safe paywall solution. Otherwise, we would cut our visibility tremendously without gaining anything, because the other networks offer a reach that we don't have now.

Instead, we should use the events to promote becoming membership in the Club, for example by a short blurb by the moderator during the introduction or other means.

In addition, we ask the President and the membership and marketing committee for a meeting to discuss ideas.
