For the month of July, the FCCJ Exhibition Committee is proud to inform that we will be staging a display of larger-than-life Ukiyo-e art prints on washi (rice) paper produced by Japan's industry-leading printer Shunichi Kida.

As I am sure the board is aware, Ukiyo-e greatly influenced the decorative art style *Art Nouveau* as well as the *Impressionism Movement* of the late 19th Century, most notably the works of Claude Monet, Pierre-Auguste Renoir, and Vincent van Gogh. Profile

Shunichi Kida (Currently preparing Ukiyo-e display for FCCJ July Exhibit)

Founder & President, QBic Dyeing and Printing Studio.

Known as a visionary and industry-leading printer in the world of graphic art, Kida explores ways to reproduce photographs, paintings, prints, illustrations, graphics, and other artworks on Japanese Washi paper using the latest digital technology.

Nominated by renowned graphic designers and photographers as a leader in his field, Kida prints numerous artworks on washi paper and displays them on super-sized screens in event venues, museums, hotel lobbies and on stage. Only Kida can command such outstanding technology.

He started his own studio in 1996 and has been developing these various forms of expression since then. Over the years, he has produced works for events in Japan, France, Mongolia, the U.S., Russia and Italy.

Kida has agreed to create a grand Ukiyo-e display in the corridor gallery of the FCCJ for the July 2025 exhibition, produced by art director Fukuko Okuno. Okuno is currently raising funds for this project.

PROFILE

Kentaro Makino

Former NHK Producer

Producer responsible for the Japanese side of the Ukiyo-e digitization project co-produced by the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston and NHK Promotion.

Councilor of the National Federation of UNESCO Associations in Japan

Many Ukiyo-e works collected by Frank Lloyd Wright and later donated to the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston are said to be the best preserved in the world because the condition of the donation was "never to be exhibited or shown to the public" and as such, they have been kept in perfect condition without being exposed to sunlight.

Makino has spearheaded a project to photograph the collection with a digital camera and make effective use of it as a cultural heritage.

Ukiyo-e Boom

Makino is the spark that ignited the current Ukiyo-e boom, and he calls himself a "digital evangelist of Ukiyo-e" rather than a researcher.

His lectures, which are like time travel back to the Edo period, have been well received not only in Japan but also at art museums in London, Paris, and New York.

Makino is the only speaker who introduces Ukiyo-e in a fun, fascinating way by deciphering the mysteries hidden in Ukiyo-e, the stylishness of the Edo period, the wisdom of the common people, and the playful spirit that the Edo people enjoyed, rather than critiquing Ukiyo-e as an art form.

From secret codes hidden in Ukiyo-e to amazing techniques imitated by Van Gogh and Monet. Makino shares the world of Ukiyo-e enjoyed by the Edo people with his outstanding knowledge, information, passion for Ukiyo-e, and skillful talk with a touch of humor.

He is a unique "evangelist" who captivates not only enthusiasts but also those who have no interest in Ukiyo-e.

His lectures and talk shows are always fully booked, and his popularity continues to soar.

He is also the author of "Anatomy of Ukiyo-e" published by X-Knowledge Co. 2020
