I am an American academic/lawyer, author, consultant on Information Security, Cybersecurity, Data Protection, Data Privacy and speaker at conferences in Japan, Asia, the United States, Canada and Europe. I have been a consultant at United Nations headquarters on copyright law and policy. I have also been a speaker on satellite television in India and on two global radio programs discussing cybercrime and cybersecurity.

I was a tenured Full Professor and Founder of the Asia-Pacific Cyberlaw, Cybercrime and Internet Security Research Institute at Waseda University School of Law for 22 years. My main publication for the past eighteen years has been the law treatise CYBERCRIME AND SECURITY, published by Thomson Reuters/West and on the Westlaw database for over ten years. It is updated quarterly. There is coverage of law, policy, cases. I have enjoyed working with lawyers, professors, Information Security and Cybersecurity experts. Another one of my books is LAW, POLICY AND TECHNOLOGY, a multidisciplinary collaboration of experts. I received the Regional Asia Information Security Achievement Award from ISC(2) in Hong Kong in 2017. I am a longtime member of the Regional Asia Information Exchange and train tech experts in legal and policy trends.

I would like to assist the Club in staying up to date with IT and being an attractive venue for future journalists. I currently mentor law students and new lawyers interested in Information Technology and enjoy answering their questions about law and technology. I have been in leadership in the American Bar Association International Section and its Dispute Resolution Section, and am a trained arbitrator and mediator. I am also trained in Public Affairs Leadership and attended the First East Coast CORO Foundation Public Affairs Leadership program for women in New York. CORO has trained women legislators, ambassadors and White House staff over the years and has enabled me to figure out how chaos operates in society, especially now.

One contribution I have been thinking of making is a digital literacy guide for our members. I would also like to explain security awareness when utilizing Club facilities and also for those working from home in Japan. Another idea is to produce films and YouTube presentations with our IT Committee and tech people in Japan. I can also assist the Club in fundraising among tech corporations and non-profits in Japan and elsewhere.
